

The Industrial Workers of the World Environmental Committee extends our love and solidarity with activists taking part in this years Climate Camp Ireland, which takes place in County Tyrone in August.

Climate Camp Ireland will take place at Ardboe, Co Tyrone, on the shore of Ireland's biggest lake, Loch nEachach (Lough Neagh) from **August 7th to 11th 2024**, where environmentalists, community campaigners and others from across Ireland will come together to share skills and strategies for building a radical climate movement.

This year's Camp will focus on the ecological disaster at Loch nEachach and support local campaigns working to protect the Loch, as well as groups resisting gold-mining in the Sperrins. They also aim to highlight other environmental campaigns in Ireland and internationally.

The Camp stands against destruction of community, the exploitation of land, and the politics of hate.

They gather to gether to say No to a ruthless capitalist model that demands never-ending growth and profit. They stand for communities, not shareholders.

A spokesperson for the **IWW Environmental Committee** said that, "This event is an important part of the environmental fight back here in Ireland. It will bring together many important grassroots campaigns at a time when we need to make that vital connection between our earth and the labour movement.

"The IWW Environmental Committee recently made a important delegation to the **Greencastle Peoples Office** within the Sperrin Mountians, to extend our solidarity with the community's opposition to toxic gold mining by multinationals.

"What we came away with, was the importance of grassroots struggle making links with the labour movement locally, as well as internationally. This can be seen by the work carried out by the **Save Our Sperrins** campaign, who since 2015, have toured the length of Ireland and beyond to highlight the dangers of toxic gold mining.

"They have giving energy to smaller community campaigns who also see the importance of connecting these environmental struggles with the labour movement. We extend our solidarity with Climate Camp Ireland and encourage others to do the same."

Galway Solidarity Against Evictions!

Following today's solidarity action, a spokesperson for the IWW in Galway said, "In the middle of a housing crisis, with no money, these human beings are being turfed out onto the streets or are being sent to live in what is the equivalent to chicken coops for people.

"Several sharing just one toilet, often in the middle of nowhere with no amenities and scum for management.

"What is for sure is that such evictions should be met with solidarity actions, such as this today.

"A proactive community and trade union re-



sponse is vital to counteracting ruthless acts such as what we are increasingly witnessing. "We are asking those interested in social justice and working class solidarity to get active and get involved"

WORKERS FOR PALESTINE



The Industrial Workers of the World (IWW) was proud to march in Galway today alongside hundreds of other protesters to call for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza.

The infamous red IWW banner joined a sea of Palestinian flags billowing past the Corrib river and the Spanish Arch, up through Shop Streetand into Eyre Square in Galway city centre.

In the city of tribes - at the height of the Galway Arts Festival - protesters chanted, made speeches, played music, and even danced the Dabke.

A spokesperson for the IWW said that "The

Wobblies were honoured to join the men, women and children present in reaffirming Ireland's historical solidarity with Palestine, and the IWW's kinship with the underdog everywhere.

"Our message from Galway is loud and clear. We demand an immediate ceasefire and an end to the occupation of Palestine."
