SOLIDARITY WITH WORKERS IN PALESTINE END THE OCCUPATION!



Members of the Industrial Workers of the World participated in yet another solidarity action with the people of Palestine at Dublin Port.

The temporary blockade of Dublin Port came despite the recent uneasiness surrounding the Trump-designed 'ceasefire' in Gaza.

As the crowd's dispersed, a spokesperson for the IWW Dublin group said, "For many looking in on the so-called ceasefire in Palestine, the atrocities continue for the people of Palestine. Little or nothing has actually changed. With that being the case, our solidarity actions must continue, which is why we are here again today at Dublin Port."

"For the majority here today, for those of us who have taken part, we strongly believe that no one should remain silent while the Zionist terror continues to inflict its relentless oppression throughout Palestine."

At a previous action to blockade Dublin Port, many witnessed first hand the brutali-

ty of An Garda Síochana towards Palestinian supporters. Several were arrested by excessive force while many others had been pepper-sprayed in an attempt to break up the peaceful solidarity action.

This time around, activists once again conducted themselves with dignity, whilst learning from previous actions by putting in place first-aid volunteers to support fellow activists on the ground, of which IWW members took participated in.

Amazingly, guards stopped-and-searched volunteers under drugs legislation, interrogating them about the "Sodium Chloride" (i.e. salt) listed in the ingredients of their saline solution.

They questioned the need for first-aiders to bring saline solution for treating pepper-spray, as if guards had not been trigger-happy with the pepper-spray at previous port actions!

VICTROY IN TECH WORKERS UNFAIR DISMISSAL!


